

Every first Friday of the month we have extended Eucharistic Adoration beginning at 9:00am to 8:00am Saturday morning. Please consider spending one hour with our Eucharistic Lord. A sign up sheet is in the narthex. In the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us and desires to become one with us; eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the eucharistic celebration, which is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration. Mass and Reconciliation on the First Saturday

Please join us the first Saturday of the month at 8:00am for Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow Mass at 8:40 am. In reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary include the following elements, performed with the intention of reparation for blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart, for at least five consecutive months:

- Confession (shortly before or after the First Saturday so long as the person receives Holy Communion in a state of
- Holy Communion received on the First Saturday of each 2) month;
- the Holy Rosary, five decades recited sometime during the day; and
- meditating for 15 minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary



### From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



### I. Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions cont.

372. Ritual Masses are connected to the celebration of certain Sacraments or Sacramentals. They are prohibited on Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter, on Solemnities, on the days within the Octave of Easter, on the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), on Ash Wednesday, and during Holy Week, and furthermore due regard is to be had for the norms set out in the ritual books or in the Masses themselves.

373. Masses for Various Needs and Occasions are used in certain situations either as occasion arises or at fixed times.

Days or periods of prayer for the fruits of the earth, prayer for human rights and equality, prayer for world justice and peace, and penitential observances outside Lent are to be observed in the Dioceses of the United States of America at times to be designated by the Diocesan

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. The liturgical celebrations for this day may be the Mass "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life" (no. 48/1 of the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions), celebrated with white vestments, or the Mass "For the Preservation of Peace and Justice" (no. 30 of the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions), cele-brated with violet vestments.

#### De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

### I. Misas y oraciones para diversas circunstancias cont.

372. Las Misas rituales están relacionadas con la celebración de algunos Sacramentos o Sacramentales. Se prohíben en los domingos de Adviento, Cuaresma y Pascua, en las solemnidades, en los días de la octava de Pascua, en la Conmemoración de todos los fieles difuntos, en el Miércoles de Ceniza y en las ferias de Semana Santa; guárdense, además, las normas establecidas en los rituales o en las mismas Misas. 373. Las Misas por diversas necesidades o en diversas circunstancias se escogen en ciertas situaciones que se dan, bien ocasionalmente, bien en tiempos determinados.

Días o períodos de oración por los frutos de la tierra, la oración por los derechos humanos y la igualdad, la oración por la justicia y la paz mundial, y las observancias penitenciales fuera de la Cuaresma serán observadas en las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América en tiempos que serán designados por el Obispo diocesano.

En todas las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, el 22 de enero (o el 23 de enero, cuando el 22 de enero cae en domingo) será observado como un día especial para orar por el pleno restablecimiento de la garantía legal del derecho a la vida, y de la penitencia por la violación a la dignidad de la persona humana mediante actos de aborto. Las celebraciones litúrgicas para este día pueden ser tomadas de la Misa "Para dar gracias a Dios por el don de la vida humana" (n. 48/1 de las Misas y oraciones por varias necesidades y para diversas circunstancias), celebrando con vestimentas blancas, o la Misa "Por la paz y la justicia" (n. 30 de las Misas y oraciones por varias necesidades y para diversas circunstancias), celebrando con vestimentas moradas.

### CCC - Paragraph 7. The Fall

### I. Where Sin Abounded, Grace Abounded All the More The reality of sin

386 Sin is present in human history; any attempt to ignore it or to give this dark reality other names would be futile. To try to understand what sin is, one must first recognize the profound relation of man to God, for only in this relationship is the evil of sin unmasked in its true identity as humanity's rejection of God and opposition to him, even as it continues to weigh heavy on human life and history. (1847)

387 Only the light of divine Revelation clarifies the reality of sin and particularly of the sin committed at mankind's origins. Without the knowledge Revelation gives of God we cannot recognize sin clearly and are tempted to explain it as merely a developmental flaw, a psychological weakness, a mistake, or the necessary consequence of an inadequate social structure, etc. Only in the knowledge of God's plan for man can we grasp that sin is an abuse of the freedom that God gives to created persons so that they are capable of loving him and loving one another. Original Sin—an essential truth of the faith

388 With the progress of Revelation, the reality of sin is also illuminated. Although to some extent the People of God in the Old Testament had tried to understand the pathos of the human condition in the light of the history of the fall narrated in Genesis, they could not grasp this story's ultimate meaning, which is revealed only in the light of the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.261 We must know Christ as the source of grace in order to know Adam as the source of sin. The Spirit-Paraclete, sent by the risen Christ, came to "convict the world concerning sin,"262 by revealing him who is its Redeemer. (431, 208, 359, 729)

Confirmation is the sacrament where God the Holy Spirit

makes you strong to serve in the kingdom of God. You can serve God right now, right where you are.

### 70. How is Confirmation celebrated?

The bishop places his hands over the person to be confirmed and calls down the —> Holy Spirit. Then he anoints the person with chrism, drawing the Sign of the Cross on his forehead. He calls the person by name and says,

N., be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The sponsor stands behind the person as he is confirmed, with his hand gently placed upon the person's shoulder.
