### II. Masses for the Dead cont.

381. A Mass for the Dead, on receiving the news of a death, for the final burial, or the first anniversary, may be celebrated even on days within the Octave of the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas), on days when an Obligatory Memorial occurs, and on weekdays other than Ash Wednesday or the weekdays of Holy Week.

Other Masses for the Dead or "daily" Masses, may be celebrated on weekdays in Ordinary Time on which Optional Memorials occur or when the Office is of the weekday, provided such Masses are actually applied for the dead.

382. At Funeral Masses there should usually be a short Homily, but to the exclusion of a funeral eulogy of any kind.

383. The faithful, and especially those of the deceased's family, should be urged to participate in the Eucharistic Sacrifice offered for the deceased person, also by receiving Holy Communion.

384. If the Funeral Mass is directly joined to the rite of burial, once the Prayer after Communion has been said and omitting the Concluding Rites, there takes place the Rite of Final Commendation or Farewell. This rite is celebrated only if the body is present.

385. In the arranging and choosing of the variable parts of the Mass for the Dead, especially the Funeral Mass (for example, orations, readings, and the Universal Prayer), pastoral considerations bearing upon the deceased, the family, and those attending should be kept in mind. Moreover, pastors should take into special account those who are present at a liturgical celebration or who hear the Gospel on the occasion of the funeral and who may be non-Catholics or Catholics who never or hardly ever participate in the Eucharist or who seem even to have lost the faith. For Priests are ministers of Christ's Gospel for all.

### II. Misas de difuntos cont.

381. La Misa de difuntos que se dice después de recibida la noticia de la muerte, o con ocasión de la sepultura definitiva, o en el primer aniversario, puede celebrarse aun dentro de la octava de Navidad, y en los días en que ocurre una memoria obligatoria o cualquier feria, que no sea la del Miércoles de Ceniza o una de las de Semana Santa.

Las otras Misas de difuntos, o Misas "cotidianas", pueden celebrarse en las ferias del Tiempo Ordinario en que cae alguna memoria libre o se hace el Oficio de la feria, con tal que verdaderamente se apliquen por los difuntos.

382. En las Misas exequiales téngase regularmente una breve homilía, excluyendo todo género de elogio fúnebre.

383. Exhórtese a los fieles, sobre todo a los familiares del difunto, a que participen en el sacrificio eucarístico ofrecido por él, también acercándose a la Comunión.

384. Si la Misa exequial está directamente relacionada con el rito de las exequias, una vez dicha la oración después de la Comunión, se omite todo el rito de despedida y en su lugar se reza la última recomendación o despedida; este rito solamente se hace cuando está presente el cadáver.

385. Al seleccionar y ordenar para la Misa de difuntos, y especialmente para la Misa exequial, las partes variables (por ejemplo: oraciones, lecturas, oración universal) ténganse en cuenta, como es debido, los motivos pastorales respecto al difunto, a su familia, a los presentes.

Tengan, además, especial cuidado los pastores por aquellas personas que, con ocasión de los funerales, asisten a las celebraciones litúrgicas y oyen el Evangelio; personas que pueden no ser católicas o que son católicos que nunca o casi nunca participan en la Eucaristía, o que han perdido la fe: los sacerdotes son ministros del Evangelio de Cristo para todos.

#### III. Original Sin cont.

Man's first sin

397 Man, tempted by the devil, let his trust in his Creator die in his heart and, abusing his freedom, disobeyed God's command. This is what man's first sin consisted of 278 All subsequent sin would be disobedience toward God and lack of trust in his goodness. (1707, 2541, 1850, 215)

398 In that sin man preferred himself to God and by that very act scorned him. He chose himself over and against God, against the requirements of his creaturely status and therefore against his own good. Constituted in a state of holiness, man was destined to be fully "divinized" by God in glory. Seduced by the devil, he wanted to "be like God," but "without God, before God, and not in accordance with God."279 (2084, 2113)

399 Scripture portrays the tragic consequences of this first disobedience. Adam and Eve immediately lose the grace of original holiness.280 They become afraid of the God of whom they have conceived a distorted image—that of a God jealous of his prerogatives.281

The harmony in which they had found themselves, thanks to original justice, is now destroyed: the control of the soul's spiritual faculties over the body is shattered; the union of man and woman becomes subject to tensions, their relations henceforth marked by lust and domination.282 Harmony with creation is broken: visible creation has become alien and hostile to man.283 Because of man, creation is now subject "to its bondage to decay." 284 Finally, the consequence explicitly foretold for this disobedience will come true: man will "return to the ground," 285 for out of it he was taken. Death makes its entrance into human history. 286 (1607, 2514, 602, 1008)
